

The outstanding comedy Television Cartoonist is featured with his guests!!




JOANNA DORE

HOUSE RULES

- Admission by membership card only.
- No obscene language will be tolerated in the club.
- The Custodian or his authorized representative has the authority to remove any person from the Club for violating club regulations or for conduct unbecoming a lady or gentleman.
- Any active member whose membership card is revoked or is voluntarily surrendered, for any reason, will be denied all privileges of the Club, until he has been reinstated by an act of the Board of Governors, and upon the member's petition.
- Tagging on the dance floor is strictly prohibited.

- All persons are forbidden to wear shirts, sweaters without collars, dungarees, leather trousers, and/or mixed uniforms in the club.

7. MINORS

- Dependents of Armed Forces personnel under age 21 will not be permitted in any part of mess unless accompanied by a responsible adult.
 - All other minors under age 18, will not be permitted in club unless accompanied by a responsible adult.
 - All minors must conform to commonly accepted standards of conduct and dress while on premises.
- Complaints will be discussed only with the Club Manager on duty.

- Monday thru Friday ladies in slacks will not be admitted in the Club after 1500 hours. Slacks will not be admitted on Saturday, Sunday, and holidays. Shorts are not permitted at any time.
- All persons in fatigues will leave the Club at 1900 hours or retire to the Stag Bar.
- No Ladies allowed in Stag Bar.
- Dance Floor will not be reserved on floor show nights.
- Not over 6 (six) persons at any small table.
 - Not over eight persons at large banquet type table.
 - Members will not push tables together.
- Members are not allowed in the Main Club on Sundays, Holidays, in fatigues.
