
homes, etc. This is your newsletter, and any information that you might like to see in it, as to Squadron Activities, coming events, and the like, just let us know.



Top Records in the States







HOUSE RULES

- 1. Admission by membership card only,
- 2. No obscene language will be tolerated in the club.
- 3. The Custodian or his authorized representative has the authority to remove any person from the Club for violating club regulations or for conduct unbecoming a lady or centleman.
- 4. Any active member whose membership card is revoked or is voluntarily surrendered, for any reason, will be denied all privileges of the Club, until he has been reinstated by an act of the Board of Governors, and upon the member's petition.
- 5. Tagging on the dance floor is strictly prohibited

5. All persons are forbidden to wear shirts, sweaters without cellars, dungarees, leather trousers, and/or mixed uniforms in the club.

7. MINORS

- a. Dependents of Armed Forces personnel under age 21 will not be permitted in any part of mess unless accompanied by a responsible adult.
